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TP also aims to encourage the advancement of Pilipino as the dominant medium of artistic and literary expression in playwriting and other forms of artistic endeavors by staging theatre productions in Pilipino, both traditional and contemporary and by establishing a training institute for theater talents proficient in the use of Pilipino as a principal mode of communication and as vehicle for projecting human experience.

Talks between **AIDE** and TP on the possible

collaboration to offer short courses on Arts and Culture has been going on since 2017. This is to fully define the mechanics and guidelines of the partnership.

The courses to be offered, the content, the writing of learning materials are among those that were fine-tuned and clarified. Also, the laying down of terms of reference of each parties, the teachers, mode of delivery and validation are also among the important things that were discussed and settled.

It must be noted that in the early 80's, AIDE among the few higher education institutions which initially offered Liberal Arts and Associate in Arts courses leading to Bachelor of Arts course.
