LABOR ECONOMICS

This course introduces how the labor market works and focuses on the behavior of profit-maximizing firms and utility-maximizing workers in the labor market, and the implied equilibrium of labor demand and supply. Specifically, this module presents an overview of labor economics. The importance of labor economics is emphasized. Data on the Philippine labor force are likewise presented. Relevant concepts and terms are also defined.



INTERNATIONAL ECONOMICS

The course deals with the study of classical theory of international trade; modern developments of the pure trade theory, analysis of terms of trade, and balance of payments mechanism; includes close study of the current account and capital account of the balance of payments of Philippine imports and exports.

Further, the course discusses, other than the theory of international trade, the mechanics of foreign exchange markets. Costs and benefits of international economic interdependence. Discussion of current problems in international trade and monetary policy.

- 3. List trade policy instruments and explain their effects on nations' welfare;
- Analyze causes and effects of exchange rate variations and apply that knowledge to the analysis of current issues in international finance;
- 5. Explain the impact of the global economy on business conduct and performance as well as the effects of business actions on the global economy;
- 6. Demonstrate the ability to think critically and objectively by relating current issues in international economics to the material learned in class.
