My Study Journey – How I began

It has been my desire to finish my course, or at least to earn a four-year course college degree program, but because I got married in a younger age and gave birth to my first child, I was not able to finish my college education which I started in one of the reputable universities in Manila way back in the 1980's. She introduced to me the opportunity of going back to school and finish my undergraduate degree while taking care of my 2-year old toddler at that time. My heart pounded fast, I was so excited then, I said to myself, at last I can finish my four-year course while I am not compromising my motherhood! I mean...
